02	Otero County NM	11:45 AM – <b>aging electrical wire</b>	2 horses, a goat, a dog and 2 puppies were saved but 2 roosters, 10 laying hens and 3 baby chicks perished
04	Ste. Anne, Manitoba CANADA	6:15 PM – under investigation	450 dairy cows died
04	Gilman MN	2:31 AM – undetermined	6 or 7 steers were evacuated but 6 were killed
04	Oak Bluff Dairy Farm, Frederick County MD	Daytime – <b>spontaneous combustion of hay bales</b>	70 cows were rescued but 100 perished
07	East Huntingdon, PA	1:00 PM – <b>probably electrical</b>	More than 100 pigs were in barn, about 40 escaped the fire
08	Foxwood Farms, Chapel Hill NC	3:37 AM – under investigation	13 horses died
09	Halsey WI	3:37 AM – under investigation	22 cattle died
10	Luymes Dairy Farm, Lacombe, Alberta CANADA	Early Afternoon – under investigation	30 young dairy heifers and bulls died
12	Indiana Stallion Station, Chesterfield IN	Time not stated – ruled accidental	14 horses died
13	Sunnyfield Farm, Peterborough NH	Time not stated – <b>possibly heat lamp</b>	200 chickens died
14	New Prague MN	4:30 AM – under investigation	30 hogs were saved but 60-90 died
15	Cedar Hill Farms, Warrington Twp PA	6:20 PM – <b>possibly electrical</b>	All 57 cattle were evacuated
19	Abbotsford WI	Afternoon – undetermined	All 150 dairy cows were saved, but one human died
29	Young Farms, Evans Mills NY	10:00 PM – under investigation	70 cows and 15-20 yearlings died
